Team Up!*

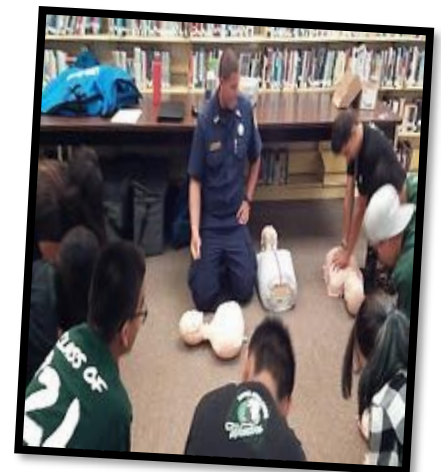

Even something as small as starting compressions can make all the difference when it comes to life or death.

Bystander CPR Saves Lives
If you suffer sudden cardiac arrest, your best chance at survival is receiving bystander CPR until EMTs arrive. When a CPR-trained bystander is near, they can double, even triple these victims' survival rates by giving victims the help they need until the EMTs arrive.

As previously announced, starting with the 2016-2017 school year, the Hawaii State Department of Education student information system, Infinite Campus, will provide parents with the ability to view their secondary school child(ren)'s academic information through the Infinite Campus Portal. Logging into this web-based system will permit you to view the following real-time information about your child: Attendance, grades, class schedules, and assignments. The Portal will also contain a messaging function to help you communicate with your children's teachers.
